Even though Ulster and Scotland are just 13 miles apart, the story of the close connections can be hard to find in most museums. Here at the Discover Ulster-Scots Centre you can discover thousands of years of history, from the formation of the Giant's Causeway (which links County Antrim with the Western Isles of Scotland) right up to the present day.

- the **exhibition panels** cover ten major stories, starting with the arrival of Edward Bruce in 1315
- the **Montgomery gallery** which showcases the role of Ulster-Scots in the development of the United States of America
- the **language and literature area** gives examples of Ulster-Scots publishing, as well as words most people use every day
- a large journey planner map highlights other Ulster-Scots places to visit
- display cases feature rare artefacts and publications
- free literature showcasing history, language and culture, much of which isn't available elsewhere
- gift shop offering books, CDs and a collection of other items

The Centre is located within the historic **Belfast Corn Exchange** building which dates from 1852. In 1859 the Corn Exchange hosted a major Robert Burns centenary event which was attended by Burns' descendants who lived in the city.

The Centre also hosts a range of **events** during the year, so keep an eye on our events programme to see what's on next.
